Are you willing, for Jesus' sake, to go out of your comfort zone?

First, I want to thank you who prayed for me while I was on a mission trip to Slovakia last month. Sometimes God calls us to leave the comforts and familiarity of home for the sake of bringing the Good News of Jesus to others.

Even when God calls you to stay home, there are times that a Christian will be called to get uncomfortable for the Gospel. This happens any time you are called to do something difficult for Him.

The question is: Will you do it?

You may think you are too weak to do it, and that is true. Jesus said "Apart from Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). But then you will hear what the angel told Mary when she was given an impossible task "The Holy Spirit shall come upon you" (Luke 1).

If you are facing a difficult task today, pray "Holy Spirit, fill me and give me the grace to do the difficult thing to which you are calling me." Yes, the Bible teaches apart from Jesus we can do nothing, but then it also adds "I can do all things through Christ who gives me the strength" (Philippians 4:13).

What is a Christian Worldview?

Today we live with more competing “worldviews” than in any time in history. These worldviews are manifest in philosophies of life that directly impact us everyday. Permit me to give you three examples.

Worldview Philosophies.

If your worldview philosophy is that “love” is the highest form of purity and living you will accept any lifestyle, any belief, any action so long as it can be defined as “loving.”


If your worldview philosophy is that “God helps those who help themselves” then you will develop a disdain for people who cannot make it, pull themselves up by their bootstraps, or succeed in life through hard work.

If your worldview philosophy views life from a “cause and effect” scientific measurement basis then there is no room for the miraculous, supernatural or the reality of God. As case in point is the German Philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche (1844–1900). His worldview, which became very popular in Germany, included the will to power, the claim that God is dead, the distinction between master and slave moralities, and radical perspectivism. His later works involved a sustained attack on Christianity and Christian morality, and he seemed to be working toward what he called the transvaluation of all values (Umwertung aller Werte). He also put forth the worldview of the German superman who was meant to rule the world.

Twenty-five years after the death of Nietzsche an Austrian named Adolph Hitler picked up with worldview and gave birth to National Socialism (NAZISM) with the result that over 50,000,000 people died in world war two.

What is a biblical worldview? Focus on the Family’s The Truth Project uses the following working definition:

“A worldview is a comprehensive set of truth claims that purport to paint a true picture of reality. A comprehensive biblical worldview is one that includes and fundamentally understands God’s truth claimed over every area of life. Our personal worldview is the total set of truth claims that we have bought, consciously or subconsciously, which drive our emotions and what we think and do in unguarded moments — reflecting what we believe to be really real.

In the next article we will expand this idea of a biblical worldview and why every Christian needs to be able to articulate a worldview that governs and directs their lives.

ASK THE PASTOR

Pastor Brock,

A hard question: Does God ever cause human disaster?

PASTOR BROCK RESPONDS: "God doesn't cause famines, hurricanes, AIDS, or 9/11 type events, because God is a God of love" we often hear, especially from pastors. When Pat Robertson hints that God may be involved in judging our world through catastrophe, the media goes ballistic. I believe the media is wrong. We need to accept the hard truth of verses like Amos 3:6 *"...does disaster come to a city unless the Lord has done it?"* and Exodus 4:11 *"Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Who has made man's mouth? Who makes him mute, or deaf, or seeing, or blind? Is it not I the Lord?'"* I don't know how to read these and similar verses without concluding: God does indeed cause human disaster. Our job as Christians is to repent and call others to repentance lest the disaster comes to us. This was Jesus' advice in Luke 13:4 *"Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish."*

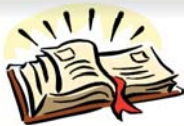




Prayer Shawl Ministry

Micah Jones: I am hoping to see successfulness in people's lives by coming to Jesus.



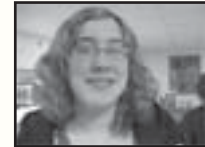
Julissa Douville: I am going on this trip because I had a lot of fun in South Dakota; I love big family trips.

Ben Smith: I would like to see my brothers and sisters in Christ working on helping others.



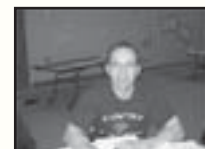
Tom Brock: Pray for God to give me opportunities to share Christ and to have a good attitude.

Kathy Bernards: I am going to serve as a family... and to learn to be less dependent on my blow dryer.



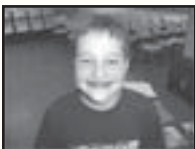
Danielle Thompson: I am wanting God to make me aware of other people's needs and to make me more thankful.

Diana Thompson: I hope to focus on Him.



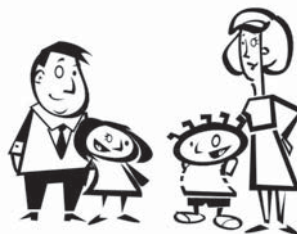
Wilson Bernards: I am going to share the Word of the Lord.
